

In Science, we are continuing to learn more about the world around us through mixtures and solutions. We just finished our learning about extracts and where they come from. We also talked about how extracts are used in everyday life!

This month for Social Studies we are taking a break from our Studies Weekly to focus on the School District Writing Challenge. 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade are thinking about what civil rights really means to us and others. We will be creating writing projects inspired by the amazing acts and deeds of civil rights activists in order to learn and appreciate the hard work and dedication done by civil rights leaders/role models.

DEVELOP A LOVE FOR READING!

Great readers truly love to read. All readers may not love to read novels but that's the great thing about reading, there are so many different kinds of text to read! It is important that your child find something that they love to read. Below are some tips to foster a LOVE of reading!

WE OF TO READ!

- Let your child explore all different kinds of text.
 Expose them to books, magazines, comics, e-books, newspapers and more! Let them choose what they want to read even if it may not be a great fit from time to time.
- Model great reading for your child. Show them how you can gain new information from text.
- Develop reading routines and establish reading times each day. Read aloud to your child.
- Take them to the library or bookstore. Ask your child's teacher for other ways to borrow books.
- Talk to your child about what they're reading, ask them questions to check for understanding.



I encourage and challenge your child to practice writing by writing out their own Valentine's this holiday. Whether they are from scratch or ones that are pre bought. It is also a great idea to have your child find paper and writing utensils outside of their school day. I will be providing each grade level at Downsville with some fun February writing prompts to enjoy writing about.

2nd grade-"SL⊖€? BOOK" zZz... Wear school appropriate pajamas to school.


3rd grade-"FOX IT SOCKS"... Wear crazy SOCKS.


4th grade-"Wacky Wednesday"... wear wacky clothes, such as mismatched or backwards

During library, our K, 1, and 2 students read each book and do an activity to help them remember the book and their favorite parts.


When all 5 titles have been read, students do a quick review, and then vote for the book they feel should win the Golden Archer Award.
