
Hello Downsville Elementary Families!

4th Grade News! I am very proud of the entire 4th grade class for their work for the Battle of the Books Competition. In Battle of the Books, the students worked in teams to read 20 different books and then had to answer questions about the books. As a class, the students read 92 books in all. We had four teams with 4 members each. Our top team was The Main Idea. Members of the team included: Drew, Kinsley, Lexi, and Tyler. They competed against the fifth graders' top team to see who would represent Downsville at the state battle. We lost by one tie-breaker question. We wish the best of luck to the fifth-grade team with the state battle.



In reading and writing, students are working on being good researchers. The students researched countries that their ancestors came from. They are now using their research to write feature articles about their countries. The students are also reading about a topic that interests them and will create presentations to teach others about what they have learned.

Math is all about fractions right now. The students are learning how to place

fractions on a number line, how to compare fractions, and how to find equivalent fractions. I have been hearing a lot of "Fractions are FUN!"

We are wrapping up our science unit on energy. The highlight of the unit was when we learned how electrical energy flows through a path and we got to show off our knowledge by making our own flashlights.

Along with all of the awesome work the 5th graders have been doing, we had two very exciting things happen last month.



Then they had a competition where they had to answer questions about the stories. The other exciting event to happen in 5th grade is the adoption of 200 trout. The students recently began to raise trout eggs. They will be in charge of taking care of the trout which includes making sure all of the equipment is working, testing the water quality, and figuring out what needs to be done if there is a problem. The trout will be released into a nearby stream in the spring.

This is a program that is sponsored by the Clear Water Trout Unlimited Chapter and funding was received from the AnnMarie Grant.


BATTLE OF THE BOOKS COMPETITION IS THIS MONTH.
