

Nutrition News What makes a school lunch?

What are the requirements?

- All 5 components must be offered : Meat/Meat Alternate, Grain, Fruit, Vegetable, Milk
- Menu items are offered in the appropriate serving size for the age/group level
- Students must take at least 3 of the 5 component offerings and one must be EITHER a fruit or vegetable or a combination of fruit and vegetables
- Menus have a weekly calorie average per meal:

550-650 K-5

600-700 6-8

750-850 9-12



School Parent Involvement Policy


Downsville Elementary will involve parents in regular, two-way meaningful communication addressing student achievement and ensuring:

- •that parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning
- •that parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education
- •that parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child.

Downsville Elementary School agrees to implement required statutory requirements to:

- •Involve parents in the joint planning and development and review of the schools Title I plan through representation in spring Schoolwide planning meeting
- •Involve parents in the planning and development of effective parent involvement activities through representation on each building's Title I Needs Assessment/Evaluation Committee or Schoolwide Committee. Committee meetings will be scheduled flexibly with the scheduling needs of parents in mind. Build the schools' and parents' capacity for parent involvement by:
- •providing parents with information on state standards, assessments, requirements of Title I, monitoring their child's progress, and working with educators. Information will be provided during an annual fall meeting, through quarterly progress notices, as well as at parent-teacher conferences.
- providing materials, resources and training to help parents work with their child academic achievement. Resources will be provided in classroom newsletters and communications, through the school IMC, and the Family Resource Center. Parent trainings and family education nights will be planned each year based on the school needs assessment and may include a family Literacy Night, Math Night, etc.
- •communicating regularly with parents in clear and understandable terms. This will include opportunities for parents to participate in decision-making roles, volunteer opportunities, annual Title | meetings, classroom newsletters, an annual parent survey, parent-school compacts, and parent-teacher conferences. Parent-teacher meetings will be scheduled at any time, as requested by parents.
- •coordinating parent involvement activities with other initiatives including community based programs, HeadStart, before and after-school programs, etc.


At the Public Library
